

Independent Limited Assurance Report to the Directors of Brambles Limited

Conclusion

Based on the evidence we obtained from the procedures performed, we are not aware of any material misstatements in the Selected Sustainability Information included in the Brambles Sustainability Review 2022, which has been prepared by Brambles Limited in accordance with the Criteria for the year ended 30 June 2022.

Information Subject to Assurance

The Selected Sustainability Information subject to assurance is presented in Brambles 2022 Sustainability Review for the year to 30 June 2022 and is identified within Appendix A of this report.

Criteria Used as the Basis of Reporting

The methodologies used by Brambles Limited management to measure the Selected Sustainability Information ("the Criteria") are described in the Brambles 2022 Sustainability Supplementary Information document available on the Brambles website.

Basis for Conclusion

We conducted our work in accordance with Australian Standard on Assurance Engagements ASAE 3000 (Standard). In accordance with the Standard we have:

- used our professional judgement to plan and perform the engagement to obtain limited assurance that
 we are not aware of any material misstatements in the information subject to assurance, whether due
 to fraud or error;
- considered relevant internal controls when designing our assurance procedures, however we do not express a conclusion on their effectiveness; and
- ensured that the engagement team possess the appropriate knowledge, skills and professional competencies.

Summary of Procedures Performed

Our limited assurance conclusion is based on the evidence obtained from performing the following procedures:

- enquiries with relevant Brambles Limited personnel to understand the internal controls, governance structure and reporting process of the Selected Sustainability Information;
- re-performing, on a sample basis, key calculations
- reviews of relevant documentation including the Sustainability Supplementary Information;
- analytical procedures over the Selected Sustainability Information;
- walkthroughs of the reporting process used to gather Selected Sustainability Information;
